A regular meeting of the Town Board was held on Wednesday, October 27, 2010, at the LaGrange Town Hall, 120 Stringham Road. Supervisor Wagner called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. and the Town Clerk led the flag salute.

Supervisor Wagner asked for a motion to approve the minutes from October 13, 2010 and October 20, 2010.

Councilman O'Hare so moved, seconded by Councilman Luna and carried by all.

Public Hearing

Mr. Wagner asked for a motion to open the Public Hearing for the assessment roll for district and special improvement assessments as required by Town Law Section 202-a.

Mr. Blass explained that this hearing only concerns properties within a water or sewer district and does not pertain to any assessed value of a resident's house; but rather it is an opportunity to review the number of benefit unit charges which are assessed for water or sewer for a home. One benefit unit is assessed for any single family house located on less than two acres of property.

Councilman Beck so moved, seconded by Councilman Jessup and carried by all.

Mr. Ernest Timlin of Vail Road addressed the Board. He wanted to object to an assessment of 1.23 benefit units for his one family home which is located on 2.78 acres. His residence existed prior to the establishment of the water district and he uses less water since his property has not been sub-divided and his property is located in the Manchester Water District. He stated that he feels that he is not getting anymore benefit than someone on a one acre lot.

Mr. Wagner thanked him for the valid points he made.

Ms. Livigni stated that her personal recommendation would be to have all single family homes assessed for one benefit unit regardless of the size of their property. She stated that she had previously discussed this matter with the Board. Councilmen Beck and Luna agreed with her recommendation.

Mr. Julius Gude of Stringham Road addressed the Board and stated that he agreed with Mr. Timlin's comments. His property is 11.3 acres and not subdivided, and has one house on it. He is assessed 3.81 benefit units and also feels that he should only be assessed one benefit unit.

Mr. Blass stated that the benefit unit for one house on more than two acres could be decreased if there is a conservation easement in place which would foreclose the potential of subdividing the property which would increase the units (density) on the land. In theory, there is increased value to real property which has the availability of water and sewer systems, i.e. municipal service. A change in the formula for the benefit assessment can be made for the next year by a simple resolution, but it would not be feasible to do it at this time.

The Board agreed with Supervisor Wagner that it would make sense to amend the formula and all agreed that further consideration will be given to this matter.

Councilman Luna moved to close the Public Hearing, seconded by Councilman Jessup and carried unanimously.

Supervisor Wagner stated that he would like a motion to set the Public Hearing for the 2011 budget for the special districts for November 10, 2010 in order to have time to publish the notice of the hearing in the newspaper.

Councilman Luna moved to do so, seconded by Councilman O'Hare and carried unanimously.

Mr. Wagner then asked for a motion to accept the Preliminary 2011 budget subject to the Public Hearing.

Councilman Luna so moved seconded by Councilman O'Hare.

Supervisor Wagner stated that a lot of work had gone into the budget, including meetings with department heads, numerous workshops and meetings with the Board and Comptroller. He gave an overview going back to 2006-2007 which shows that the tax levy has increased due to declining mortgage tax revenues. Since 2006, spending policies and controls have been examined and overhauled. Salaries in the town have been evaluated with the help of consultants. Some salaries were frozen at that time and some low end salaries were raised. The average clerical salary is around \$31,000 and this is for some employees who have been with the Town for 20-25 years. The Zoning Administrator's position has been eliminated and combined with the Building Inspector's position for a significant savings. The town's engineering firm has been changed resulting in further savings.

The Administrator of Public Works operates as a “watchdog” over consultant expenses and has saved the Town a significant amount of money. Ms. Livigni maintains control over stormwater maintenance which is very costly to municipalities. She also oversees planning and infrastructure.

Grants have been used whenever possible including the bathroom in Freedom Park, lighted stop signs at the intersection of Cross Road and Route 55, Titusville Sewer Plant aeration devices for energy efficiency, and NYS Office of Court Administration for construction, security and new computers.

Mortgage Revenue has weighed heavily on the budgets for 2008, 2009 and 2010. Prior to that, the mortgage tax revenue had kept the tax levy down with Lagrange seeing as much as 1.3 million dollars. Unfortunately, in 2008 that changed and the mortgage tax revenue continues to decline today. It is currently somewhere around \$400,000.

Actual spending from 2004-2010 has decreased due to strict spending control including the curtailment of out of Town training. Conservative budgeting and spending has resulted in an upgraded bond rating for the Town by Moody’s Investor Services.

The LaGrange Library Association had an increase of 11.43% (\$599,280.00) in 2008 to their budget even as the mortgage tax revenue began to decline.

During preparation of the budget for 2009, the Town began to implement measures to adjust for the downward turn of the economy, which included reductions to the Highway budget and General Fund. Town Hall employees did not receive a raise and Highway employees had a zero net increase.

In 2010, the total budget was 2.68% less than 2007 and Highway Department spending was cut to pre 2007 levels.

The 2011 Preliminary Budget was impacted by an increase of \$110,000 in medical insurance premiums, an increase of NYS retirement contributions of \$140,000 and a pass down of \$30,000 for election costs by the Dutchess County Board of Elections.

Supervisor Wagner stated that any further reductions made to Town departments, Highway equipment, Highway repair funding and Parks and Recreation would negatively impact the services for residents. All of the departments within the Town play a role in providing vital services for residents. A 2% salary increase for Town employees has been included, but there will be no increases for elected officials. Included in the budget is \$14,000 for debt repayment for much needed repair to the building’s roof. The roof has been leaking pretty much since the building was constructed and the HVAC system is unreliable and not energy efficient. An architect has volunteered his services to the Town for the project which will keep costs down. The Town Board has decided not to decrease the Library budget at this time and it will stand at \$599,280. Voters will have to decide on Election Day whether or not to approve the \$99,000 increase the Library Association is seeking. If the increase is approved it will cost the taxpayer an additional \$24.36 in taxes per year and will take the Library budget out of the control of the Town Board permanently and into the hands of non - elected people.

Supervisor Wagner stated that he is looking into a program implemented by the Town of Rhinebeck to transport seniors. The Rhinebeck program has a van, an operating budget of \$5,000 and is run by volunteers. The program would replace Dial-A-Ride. Dial-A-Ride is part of the LOOP system and is run by the County. It currently costs the Town \$11,000 per year and the County plans to raise that amount to about \$18,000. There are only a small number of riders in LaGrange and the majority of the Board feels that this amount is too costly for the Town.

A pilot program manned by volunteers has been discussed with the Town of Pleasant Valley. The Town currently shares a senior center in conjunction with the Town of Pleasant Valley. Mr. Wagner feels that this will be a reasonable alternative.

The preliminary budget will probably be voted on at the November 10, 2010 meeting. The Board has until November 20th to pass the 2011 budget. The tax rate will be an increase of 13.01%. Mid - year adjustments may have to be made if there are further reductions in mortgage tax revenue, additional County and State pass downs or a lack of CHIPS money which was used for Highway paving in 2010. In addition the weather, specifically snow will play a factor in Highway expenses. He also stated that they will be working on reducing Workers Comp rates, which are 12% over the average in New York State. This is a long term goal as reducing the rate will take about 3-4 years.

Councilman Luna stated that the Board had done a lot of work on this budget and he wants the fiscal responsibility for the budget kept with the Town Board because the Board is doing a great job.

Councilman Jessup stated that his opposition to the budget is based on the Library's 48.35 % increase from 2004-2008. He is fine with everything else in the budget. He also stated that he felt that the increase was unfair since everyone in Town Hall has bent over backwards to cut spending.

Councilman Beck wanted to state that the Supervisor had done a fabulous job in presenting the budget. He added that this budget does not reflect the fire district.

Councilman O'Hare stated that with respect to the Library they have had reductions in their funding just as the Town has, but the Board didn't get sufficient information necessary to make an informed decision about reducing or taking away \$50,000 from the budget.

He agreed with Mr. Wagner that we need to have people elected to run the Library.

Councilman Jessup moved to open the Public Hearing, seconded by Councilman Luna and carried by all.

There were no comments.

Councilman Luna moved to close the Public Hearing, seconded by Councilman O'Hare and carried by all.

Supervisor Wagner asked for a motion to approve the monthly report for Building, Zoning, Public Works and Planning in the amount of \$21,470.00.

Councilman O'Hare so moved, seconded by Councilman Beck and carried by all.






