The regular meeting of the Town Board was held on Wednesday, October 10, 2012, at 24 Firemen's Way, Town of LaGrange. Deputy Supervisor called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The Town Clerk led the flag salute.

Mr. Luna reviewed the Emergency Exits for the room.

Mr. Luna asked for a motion to accept the minutes for September 26, 2012. Councilman Jessup moved to do so, seconded by Councilman Dyal. The motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Luna asked for a motion to accept the minutes for October 3, 2012. Councilman Jessup moved to do so, seconded by Councilman Dyal. The motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Luna asked for a motion to accept the monthly reports for September 2012. Councilman Dyal so moved, seconded by Councilman Polhemus. The motion carried unanimously.

Supervisor's Report

Mr. Luna presented the updated list of properties which the Town has had to maintain under the Town's Property Maintenance Law. (SEE ADDENDUM)

The cost for these services will be recouped when the bills are added to the Re-Levy in November.

Councilman Jessup, seconded by Councilman Dyal moved to accept the Property Maintenance List for Re-Levy.

Councilman Jessup added for the record that the revenue from the list amounts to \$22,763.81

Agenda Items

Mr. Luna stated that rehabilitation of the Saxon Drive Pump Station which is in the Titusville Sewer District will be necessary to address overflow issues. The Administrator of Public Works submitted an outline of the proposed work. (SEE ADDENDUM)

The money is available in the District's budget so there will be no need to bond for funding of the project.

Steve Mance from Environmental Consultants added that the station has been in operation since 1968 and it is not designed to handle the run-off from storms.

Councilman Jessup moved to accept a resolution for the preparation of a Map, Plan and Report for the project and set the Public Hearing for October 24, 2012, seconded by Councilman Polhemus. The motion carried unanimously. (SEE ADDENDUM)

Mr. Luna introduced Local Law 6 – 2012 which amends code enforcement and penalties for Chapters 83,124, 197 and 240. (SEE ADDENDUM)

Councilman Dyal moved to set the Public Hearing for November 7, 2012. Councilman Polhemus seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

Mr. Luna asked the Board to appoint Domenic Benedetti to fill the part-time position of Code Enforcement Officer. Mr. Benedetti has completed all of the required training.

Councilman Jessup moved to do so, seconded by Councilman Polhemus. The motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Luna asked the Board to appoint Gary Killmer to the Conservation Advisory Committee as a replacement for Jim Traut, who has resigned.

Councilman Polhemus moved to do so, seconded by Councilman Dyal. The motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Luna stated that the Planning Board would like the Town Board's recommendation in regard to granting re-approval for Sleight Farm Subdivision Phases IV, V and VI.

Councilman Polhemus recommended the re-approval, seconded by Councilman Jessup. The motion carried unanimously.

The Building Inspector requested approval to return a permit fee, in the amount of \$335.00 to Chai's Body Work. This does not include the \$50.00 Zoning Review fee.

Councilman Jessup moved to deny the request, seconded by Councilman Dyal. The following vote was taken:

The motion carried.

Mr. Luna stated that he had received an offer from Friends of Seniors of Dutchess County, Corp. to manage the Community Senior Transportation Program. The cost would be \$2,000 per annum plus \$2.50 per passenger. The Town currently pays \$2.50 per passenger.

Councilman Polhemus moved to do so, seconded by Councilman Jessup. The motion carried unanimously.

The Building Inspector requests Town Board approval to accept a Soil Erosion Control Bonds in the amount of \$1,500 each for grid #6361-01-270503 – 111 Ridgeline Drive and grid # 6361-03-155417 – 142 Ridgeline Drive.

Councilman Polhemus moved to do so, seconded by Councilman Dyal. The motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Ralph Rabasco concurred with Mr. Beck.



In response to your letter dated September 25th, 2012, I am writing to inform you that the Town is actively working on rehabilitating the Titusville Sewer District's Saxon Drive Pump Station.


On September 25th, the Town Engineer, Environmental Consultants and I inspected the facility and discussed the need to rehabilitate not only the pumps (to handle the peak inflow and infiltration flows), but also the controls and generator. At the September 26th Town Board Workshop Meeting, I presented the issue and scope of the rehabilitation project. I have been authorized by the Town Board to proceed with the necessary Engineering and Legal work for preliminary design (Engineer's estimate of cost of work) and financial authorization of the project. We are planning on having Town Board approval (202-b process requiring a public hearing), contingent upon a positive response by both the public and Town Board, by October 24th. If approval is granted by that date, we will submit to your office a conceptual plan of improvements by November 7th, so that we can finalize the design that will obtain the Dutchess County Department of Health's approval.

I would anticipate that the Rehabilitation Project will be completed prior to the Spring of 2013, contingent upon: promptly obtaining Town Board authorization, promptly obtaining DCDOH approval and appropriate weather over the winter to perform the work. It is very likely the work could be completed earlier, however in light of the conditions I would like to maintain a conservative deadline.

Please contact me if this is not satisfactory to the Department or if you need any additional information. In the event any of these dates set forth above are unattainable, I will contact you directly.

Thank you for your attention to this matter and continued cooperation with the Town.

Dear Supervisor Luna and Members of the Town Board:

Pursuant to the Town's request, this map, plan, report describes the proposed improvement work to be included within a funding resolution for the existing Titusville Sewer District. The improvements are to be completed in accordance with the procedures of Town Law Section 202-b.

The proposed project to be completed is recommended and necessary repair and maintenance work to respond to Dutchess County Department of Health Correspondence. A specific description of work follows.

Area to be Served: Map

The proposed improvement work will serve the existing Titusville Sewer District in the Town of LaGrange. The existing District currently serves residential and commercial properties in the western portion of the Town of LaGrange.

Plan

The proposed Titusville Sewer District repair work includes the replacement of the existing pumps, control system and emergency generator which are undersized and prone to frequent failures due to the age of the equipment. The Town is proposing to install a modified pumping system with integrated controls and a new emergency generator with automatic transfer. Completion of the above work will improve operating performance and reliability.

Report

The Total Estimated Improvement Cost for the proposed Titusville Sewer District improvements is \$238,000 as itemized on the attached table.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING PREPARATION OF PLAN AND REPORT, AND
FIXING DATE OF PUBLIC HEARING, ON PROPOSED INCREASE AND
IMPROVEMENT OF FACILITIES OF TITUSVILLE SEWER DISTRICT

Councilman Jessup introduced the following resolution,
which was seconded by Councilman Dyal:

WHEREAS, the Town Board acts as Commissioners of an
existing Titusville Sewer District in the Town of LaGrange; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has received a plan and report
(the "Report") prepared by Clark Patterson Lee on October 5,
2012, which describes the need for certain improvements to the
Titusville Sewer District at an estimated cost of \$238,000,
inclusive of design, engineering, and other professional fees
(the "Cost Estimate");

NOW, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED THAT:

1. The authorization for preparation of the Report is
hereby ratified and approved.

2. The Town Board will consider the Report and Cost
Estimate for the proposed increase and improvement of the
facilities of the Titusville Sewer District at a public hearing
pursuant to Section 202-b of the Town Law.

3. The public hearing shall be held at 24 Firemen's Way in
the Town of LaGrange New York on October 24, 2012 at 7:00 P.M.,
Prevailing Time, on the proposed increase and improvement of the

facilities of the Titusville Sewer District, at which time and place said Town Board will hear all persons interested in the proposed increase and improvement, the Report, and the Cost Estimate.

4. The Town Clerk of the Town of LaGrange is hereby authorized to cause a notice of said public hearing to be published in the Poughkeepsie Journal, an official newspaper of said Town, and posted in the manner prescribed by law, which notice shall be given not less than 10 days, and not more than 20 days before the date of public hearing, in substantially the following form, to wit:

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that the Town Board of the Town of LaGrange, Dutchess County, New York, will meet at 24 Firemen's Way in the Town of LaGrange, New York, on the 24th day of October, 2012, at 7:00 o'clock P.M., Prevailing Time, for the purpose of conducting a public hearing on the proposed increase and improvement of the facilities of the Titusville Sewer District in said Town, at an estimated cost of \$238,000; consisting of the replacement of a pumping system and controls, plus emergency generator, at the Saxon Drive facility, inclusive of design, engineering and other professional fees, at which time and place said Town Board will hear all persons interested in the subject thereof concerning the same.

RESOLUTION

Councilman Dyal introduced the following proposed local law, which was seconded by Councilman Polhemus, to be known as Local Law No. 6 of 2012, entitled A LOCAL LAW OF THE TOWN OF LAGRANGE, DUTCHESS COUNTY, NEW YORK AMENDING CODE ENFORCEMENT AND PENALTIES PROVISIONS IN CHAPTERS 83, 124, 197 AND 240.

BE IT ENACTED by the Town Board of the Town of LaGrange that the Town Code is amended to read as follows:

Section 1: Subsection (C) of section 83-18, "Enforcement; penalties for offenses" is amended to remove the word "knowingly".

Section 2: Section 124-15, "Penalties for offenses" is amended to read as follows:

"Violations and penalties for offenses

A. Violations.

- (1) Unless exempted under §124-7(B), it shall be unlawful to conduct any regulated activity, as described in §124-7(C), in a wetland, watercourse, water body or buffer area without a permit issued pursuant to this chapter.
- (2) It shall be unlawful to conduct a prohibited activity, as described in §124-7(D), in a wetland, watercourse, water body or buffer area.
- (3) It shall be unlawful to conduct any activity in a wetland, watercourse, water body or

buffer area in a manner which deviates from an approved wetlands permit, unless previously approved in writing by the approval authority who issued the permit."

B. Penalties for offenses.

Any violation of this chapter is an offense, punishable by a fine not exceeding \$1,000 or imprisonment for a period not to exceed fifteen days, or both for conviction of a first offense; for conviction of a second offense both of which were committed within a period of five years, punishable by a fine not less \$1,000 nor more than \$5,000 dollars or imprisonment for a period not to exceed fifteen days, or both; and, upon conviction for a third or subsequent offense all of which were committed within a period of five years, punishable by a fine not less than \$2,000 nor more than \$15,000 or imprisonment for a period not to exceed fifteen days, or both. Each day that a violation continues shall constitute a separate offense."

Section 3: Subsection (A) of section 124-16 is

amended to read as follows:

"A. This chapter shall be enforced by the Town Administrator of Public Works, the Building Inspector or Deputy Building Inspector(s), or such other officials as may be designated by resolution of the Town Board. All enforcement officials designated under this section shall have the authority to issue appearance tickets under Article 150 of the Criminal Procedure Law of this State for purposes of enforcement of this chapter."

Section 4: Section 124-5, definition of Wetland Administrator, is amended to remove the following words: ", who shall be the Zoning Administrator".

Section 5: Section 197-20 is amended to renumber subsections (A) to (D) as (B) to (E), respectively.

Section -65: Section 197-20 is amended to renumber subsections (F) to (G) as (G) to (H), respectively.

Section 6: A new subsection (A) is added to Section 197-20 to read as follows:

"This section shall be enforced by the Town Stormwater Management Officer or such other official as designated by resolution of the Town Board. The Town Stormwater Management Officer and all officials designated under this section shall have the authority to issue appearance tickets, under Article 150 of the Criminal Procedure Law of this State."

Section 7: Subsection (E) Section 197-20 is renumbered as subsection (F) and amended to read as follows:

"F. Penalties. In addition to or as an alternative to any penalty provided herein or by law, any person who violates the provisions of this chapter shall be guilty of a violation punishable by a fine not exceeding \$350 or imprisonment for a period not to exceed 15 days, or both for conviction of a first offense; for conviction of a second offense, both of which were committed within a period of five years, punishable by a fine not less than \$350 nor more than \$700 or imprisonment for a period not to exceed 15 days, or both; and upon conviction for a third or subsequent offense, all of which were committed within a period of five years, punishable by a fine not less than \$700 nor more than \$1,000 or imprisonment for a period not to exceed 15 days, or both. Each day that a violation continues shall constitute a separate offense."

Section 8. Subsection A of section 240-86 "Penalties for offenses." is amended as follows:

"A. Violations and penalties. Any violation of this chapter is an offense, punishable by a fine not exceeding \$350 or imprisonment for a period not to exceed fifteen days, or both for conviction of a first offense; for conviction of a second offense both of which were committed within a period of five years, punishable by a fine not less \$350 nor more than \$700 dollars or imprisonment for a period not to exceed fifteen days, or both; and, upon conviction for a third or subsequent offense all of which were committed within a period of five years, punishable by a fine not less than \$700 nor more than \$1,000 or imprisonment for a period not to exceed fifteen days, or both. Each week that a violation continues shall constitute a separate offense."

Section 9: Subsection B of section 240-86

"Penalties for offenses." is amended as follows:

B. Procedure for abatement of violations. In case any building or structure is erected, constructed, reconstructed, altered, repaired, converted, or maintained or any building, structure, or land is used in violation of this chapter or of any provision of this chapter or law or regulation, the Town in addition to other remedies, may institute any appropriate action or proceedings to prevent such unlawful erection, construction, or use to restrain, correct, or abate such violation, to prevent the occupancy of said building, structure, or land, or to prevent any illegal act, conduct, business, or use in or about such premises. If the Town is successful in obtaining preliminary and/or permanent injunctive relief, it shall be entitled to an award by the court of its reasonable attorney's fees.

Section 10: This local law shall be effective upon filing with the New York State Secretary of State.

RESOLVED, that a public hearing be held in relation to the proposed local law as set forth in the form of notice,

hereinafter provided, at which hearing parties of interest and citizens shall have an opportunity to be heard, to be held at 24 Firemen's Way in the Town of LaGrange, New York, on November 7, 2012, at 6:30 o'clock p.m., Prevailing Time, and that notice of said meeting shall be published in the official newspaper of general circulation in the Town of LaGrange, by the Town Clerk, at least five (5) days before such hearing and that notice shall be in the following form:

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

TAKE NOTICE, that the Town Board of the Town of LaGrange will hold a public hearing at 24 Firemen's Way in the Town of LaGrange, New York on November 7, 2012 at 6:30.00 p.m., on Local Law No. 6 of the Year 2012, amending CODE ENFORCEMENT AND PENALTIES PROVISIONS IN CHAPTERS 83, 124, 197 AND 240.

TAKE FURTHER NOTICE, that copies of the aforesaid proposed local law will be available for examination at the office of the Clerk of the Town of LaGrange, at 24 Firemen's Way in the Town of LaGrange, New York between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. on all business days, except Tuesdays when the hours are between 8:00 a.m. and 3:30 p.m., between the date of this notice and the date of the public hearing.
